

# Jesus speaks about love

I do not normally approve of taking verses of the Bible out of context. As you have heard me say often, context matters. But sometimes it is good to see the overarching themes by looking at what is said across contexts and gospels.

The following list is not exhaustive. It is a beginning selection of things Jesus has to say about love across all four gospels. The word love is used most often in John and least often in Mark. Some of the things Jesus says about love are repeated in multiple gospels. Often Jesus' words about love include quotes from the Jewish scriptures.

Here is what I find to be the key takeaways: Jesus calls his followers and those he teaches to love God and love the neighbor, to love one another as they have been loved by him, that loving others is keeping Jesus' commands, and loving Jesus means caring for others.

In light of these many and various quotes about loving and caring for neighbors as a way to show that we love God and Jesus... how are we living that love? What actions and words are we using to show love? Silence and inaction are deafening in the face of hate and violence that harm our neighbors. If you are looking for more ways, or new ways, to show love and aren't sure where to start - let's talk. I am sure we can find a way for God's love to shine through you each day.

**Matthew 5:43-44**<sup>43</sup> "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' <sup>44</sup> But I say to you: Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you" (see also Luke 6:27-36)

**Matthew 22:36-40**<sup>36</sup> "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" <sup>37</sup> He said to him, " 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' <sup>38</sup> This is the greatest and first commandment. <sup>39</sup> And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself'. <sup>40</sup> On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets." (see also Mark 12:28-34)

**Luke 10:25-28**<sup>25</sup> "An expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. <sup>26</sup> "Teacher," he said, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" <sup>27</sup> He said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?" <sup>28</sup> He answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind and your neighbor as yourself." <sup>29</sup> And he said to him, "You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live."

**John 13:34-35**<sup>34</sup> "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another.<sup>35</sup> By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

**John 14:15**<sup>15</sup> "If you love me, you will keep <sup>16</sup> my commandments."

**John 15:9-13**<sup>9</sup> "As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. <sup>10</sup> If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. <sup>11</sup> I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete. <sup>12</sup> "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. <sup>13</sup> No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends."

**John 21:15-17**<sup>15</sup> "When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." <sup>16</sup> A second time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Tend my sheep." <sup>17</sup> He said to him the third time, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, "Do you love me?" And he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep."



### TREASURER'S DISCUSSION

- Receipts for December totaled \$24.5K, so we had a very strong month with offerings. YTD our receipts total \$272.3K which is about \$8.7K over-budget
- Spending totaled \$24.4K and was under our monthly budget by about \$400. YTD Spending totals \$263.1K which is about \$9.5K under-budget. We paid the quarterly property and liability insurance premium \$4,577 at the end of December. We paid snow and ice removal services in December totaling \$1,062.
- Net, for December we had a surplus of \$108. YTD we have a surplus of \$9,220.
- In December, PDO had receipts of \$13,152 and expenses of \$15,745. PDO had a deficit in December of \$2,593. YTD, the PDO operating account has a deficit of \$10,023. The Balance in the PDO Reserve Fund of \$8,845 was transferred to the operating account, leaving a deficit of \$1,178. PDO has receivables of \$1,995 at the end of December and as that cash comes in it will eliminate the deficit.

Approval of notes from the November meeting –  
**Approved**

Pastor's report – **Approved**

- Carrie continues to meet with members via personal visits, email, text and phone calls
- Adult Bible Study continues
- Carrie has mentioned that the contracted cleaning effort has not been good. Bathrooms have been dirty, cleaning company has had issues with staffing, some items get missed. Council needs to investigate whether our \$750 monthly budget for cleaning services (8 sessions/month) is reasonable.
- Carrie has suggested the need for a building manager, and written policies for renting space with fees, etc. Would provide a single point of contact for building needs. Dave and Bruce to draft policies.

Ministry Area reports

- Property – Bathroom stall door does not open properly in women's restroom, needs to be reversed so it opens outward, not inward. Also, sidewalk by Bell tower needs to be raised to eliminate a tripping hazard.
- Education – Sunday school continues
- Worship and Music – Christmas Eve service to be held at 5:00
- Fellowship – need to schedule a chili cook-off in the near term
- Outreach – Donations to Lumin were delivered
- PDO – Sue Sullivan is the only member left on the Personnel Committee. Staff policies and evaluations are not being completed due to lack of support. Council needs to address additional resources for the committee. Pastor Carrie has

been involved with many of the personnel situations.

Treasurer's report – Dave Mizell – **Report Accepted**  
Net for November had a deficit of \$1,271.29. Year to Date has a surplus of \$9,111.92.

- Need to establish a committee for the Labyrinth project. Will reach out to Stephens and Beckners to see if they would like to support.
